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## 1. Why did you choose to study at QUT?

After living in the USA for some time, I was invited to spend time in Australia with my extended family. Two weeks after the initial invitation, I was on a plane to Australia and spent 3 months travelling throughout Australia. I decided that Brisbane was the best destination for me to study. I made an appointment with Study Abroad the day after I got back from Australia (jetlagged!) and met with Asa to speak about my options. For Business, Study Abroad recommended QUT, Griffith University and Martin College. I was looking for a university campus environment and knew that QUT had a great reputation for Business. I also had friends in the US who were from Brisbane and spoke highly of QUT!

### 2. Why did you choose your area of study?

I chose business as I've always been more interested in that, over something like the Sciences. I thought that the skills I learned within a business degree would be highly transferable which is really important to me. I don't know where I'll be based in the future so it needed to be something that I could take with me. QUT also has a really good reputation in the area so that encouraged me further. I decided to major in Management as again, thought it would allow me to build a career in a lot of areas. I've had some really interesting units so far, e.g. Managing People and Business and Law Ethics, which makes me feel secure that I've made the right decision.

### 3. What parts of the course have been most beneficial, or have you particularly enjoyed?

I've only completed two semesters so far so my schedule has been made up mostly with core units. However, I've found this really useful as it has given me the opportunity to explore options for a second major or two minors. It has been a great base on which to work from.

## 4. What have been the highlights of your student experience at QUT so far?

## 5. Have you participated in any internships or volunteering opportunities during your time at QUT?

I haven't done any yet. My first year was all about settling into Brisbane and my studies at QUT. I plan to get involved with QUT's Real World Placement program to hopefully get an internship in something related to my Management degree. I know there are a lot of other programs available for students, for example the Business School's Business Advantage Program and the Leadership, Development and Innovation program, which I might also look into.

## 6. What opportunities for practical learning experiences have you had while at QUT?

I'm heavily involved in the QUT Guild "Your Personal Uni Wingman" which has been a rewarding experience as I get to help connect people and provide support to students. I'm also in the Norwegian Student Organisation, NorSK, which has been a lot of fun!

Although I didn't need it, I know QUT offers free airport reception which is really valuable as it provides security to students after the long flight!

It's not as hard as you think to relocate to Australia for study! It's such a good experience that it is totally worth it! Something that I've learnt is that it all comes together and will be fine! There is so much support both in Sweden and when you arrive in Australia that it will all be ok.
